

Two architectural engineering students receive ASHRAE scholarships

Two architectural engineering undergraduate students will receive scholarships from the American Society of Heating, Refrigerating and Air-Conditioning Engineers (ASHRAE) for the 2008-2009 academic year.

Alyssa Adams will receive the Henry Adams Scholarship. The scholarship was established by Henry Adams Inc., a Baltimore-based consulting firm, in memory of its founder, a charter member and former president of an ASHRAE predecessor society.

James Gawthrop will receive the Alwin B. Newton Scholarship. It was named in memory of an industry pioneer who was granted 219 patents and who strived to provide knowledge to younger people in the industry.

Each one-year scholarship is worth \$3,000.

Founded in 1894, ASHRAE strives to advance heating, ventilation, air conditioning and refrigeration to serve humanity and promote a sustainable world through research, standards writing, publishing and continuing education.
